Allison W. Bragg is an Assistant United States Attorney for the Department of Justice. As a federal prosecutor, her practice focuses on white collar crime, human trafficking, and internet crimes against children. She is on the Executive Board of the National Association of Assistant United States Attorneys, where she serves as Secretary.

AUSA Bragg's white collar crime prosecutions have included Ponzi schemes, theft of government funds, bribery, Social Security fraud, wire fraud, mail fraud, bank fraud, and other complex financial investigations. Most recently, she secured the convictions of seven defendants for their roles in a \$32 million fraud ring.

AUSA Bragg recently convicted a human trafficker, stopping his prostitution ring and securing a sentence of at least ten years. She has successfully prosecuted internet child pornographers, firearms cases, drug traffickers, and other criminals. AUSA Bragg has successfully argued before the 8th Circuit Court of Appeals.

Before joining DOJ, AUSA Bragg worked in private practice, where she litigated matters including insurance defense, medical malpractice defense, contract claims, and agribusiness. She is a *cum laude* graduate of the University of Arkansas, where she earned degrees in English and Journalism. She obtained her J.D. and LL.M. from the University of Arkansas School of Law, where she won the National Moot Court competition and was awarded Best Oral Argument in the Nation.
